The purpose of this unit of learning is to make it possible for the learners to develop into more confident individuals by learning about various foods and the importance of a balanced diet. The learners have opportunities to develop a body of knowledge and vocabulary about food. Learners will also have opportunities to apply knowledge about the effect of diet on physical and mental health in their everyday lives by learning about different types of diet, what a healthy plate looks like and about what is meant by '5 a day'.

The learners will have opportunities to be curious and ask questions when using their senses to explore various foods. We hope to develop enterprising, creative contributors who can communicate effectively when expressing their ideas and what they like.

We want to develop informed learners who are aware of their rights; especially 'the right to clean water and good food' (article 24). We strive to develop inquisitive learners, who ask natural questions to find out more.

At the end of the learning unit, we trust that the learners will be enterprising, creative contributors who have the skills and knowledge to start managing their daily lives. They will be able to relate and apply their knowledge and skills in order to plan and prepare a healthy and balanced picnic for everyone to enjoy.

Humanities

- Making and expressing opinions about food that I like and dislike
- Learning about foods from different countries
- Being curious about Welsh traditions whilst learning about Saint David

The Expressive Arts

- Use a range of media to draw cross-section pictures of fruits and vegetables
- Create transient art using a variety of foods.

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Language, Literacy and Communication

- Play games to develop concentration skills
- Create a role play area ; café, pizza parlour, ice cream shop (hold a vote)
- Listen to a variety of stories and poems that are related to the big idea
- Learn key vocabulary, phrases and songs linked to the big idea
- Learn a story to memory using Pie Corbetts techniques- The Gingerbread Man
- *Tric a Chlic* and *Iaith ar Daith* activities
- Express themselves through mark making, drawing pictures and emergent writing
- Enjoy writing a variety of genres e.g. shopping lists and recipes.

Mathematics and Numeracy

- Develop an understanding of mathematical language through game playing and role playing
- Sing number times and songs
- Count, read, write, and order numbers
- Classify foods, collect data and present it
- Investigate shapes, space, measures, money and pattern
- Solve simple problems practically.

Health and Wellbeing

- Express and make decisions relating to favourite foods
- Learn about different food groups, the healthy plate and the importance of 5 a day
- Learn about a variety of diets including veganism
- Through playing explore, discover and begin to ask questions
- Begin to understand the importance of hygiene while preparing and cooking food
- Strengthen and develop fine and gross motor skills and hand eye coordination.

Science and Technology

- Learn about the senses: concentrating on smelling, tasting and touching
- Be curious about and question how foods change while being cooked
- Learn about food processes: freezing, melting and mixing.
- Prepare a range of foods e.g fruit kebab, cawl, welsh cakes
- Use a range of equipment safely
- Plan and prepare a picnic
- Conduct a scientific investigation using tins of food
- Design an invitation to the picnic using familiar apps/programmes
- Learn how to add a name and save a piece of work.
