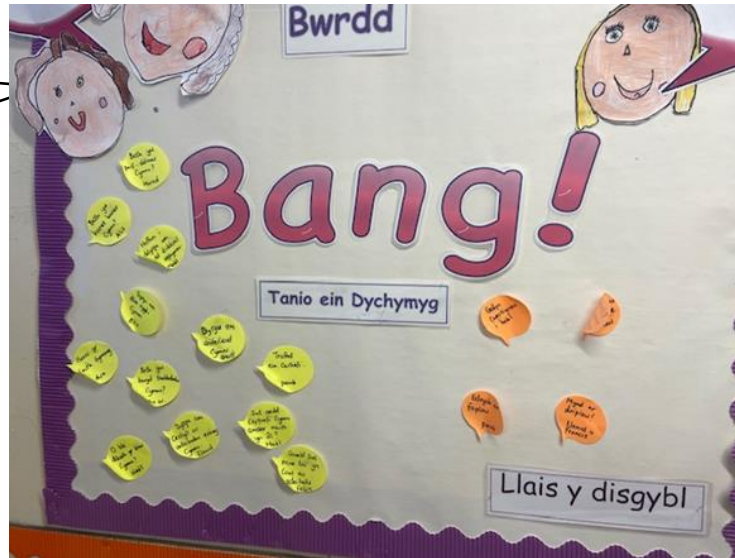
It's planning time!

Mathematics and Numeracy

Practice counting, reading, writing and arranging numbers.

Play many mental arithmetic games and enjoy problem solving.

Humanities
