Humanities

Mathematics and Numeracy

- Learning the 3x table and practising counting in threes
- Reading and halving 3 digit multiples of 100
- Understanding and partitioning 2 digit numbers
- Counting along using scales
- Adding tens and multiplying by 10
- Doubling 2 digit numbers
- Solving division number sentences using objects.
