Expressive Arts

- Look at famous portraits by Welsh artists e.g. Cedric Morris
- Practise our drawing and painting skills by creating self-portraits
- Enjoy singing familiar and new songs
- Use our senses to respond creatively to music
- Talk about how a piece of music make us feel
- Explore rhythm with our bodies
- Print with parts of the body

Language, Literacy and Communication

- Play games to develop concentration skills
- Create a 'Bryn-y-Môr Surgery' role-play area
- Listen to stories and poetry related to our big idea
- Learn vocabulary and songs about the body
- Tric a Chlic activities
- Express ourselves through mark making, drawing pictures and emergent writing
- Enjoy writing for a variety of purposes e.g. descriptive writing, invitations and cards.

Health and Well-being

- Begin to express our feelings and develop strategies to control our emotions
- Learn about the importance of looking after our bodies e.g. personal hygiene, exercise
- Develop our fitness
- Practise our hand-eye coordination, gross motor and fine motor skills

Humanities

- Talk about likes and dislikes
- Think about who are the important people in our lives and why they are important to us e.g. family
- Talk about the places which are important to us and explain why
- Recognise important events that have happened in the past e.g. birthdays
- Sequence personal events and begin to understand the concept of the future e.g. think about what we would like to do when we grow up
- Start to understand things that are similar and things that are different between us
- Learn about Christmas traditions and why Christmas is important to Christians

Mathematics and Numeracy

- Develop our understanding of mathematical language through role-play and playing games
- Sing songs and reciting number rhymes
- Count, read, write and order numbers
- Develop our adding and subtraction skills
- Sort objects, collect and present data
- Investigate measure, shape, money and pattern
- Solve simple practical problems

Science and Technology

- Learn how our bodies change as we grow
- Investigate how our bodies work e.g. our senses
- Use a variety of computing equipment safely
- Develop our coding skills by giving a series of instructions to a programmable toy
- Design, make and evaluate a Christmas decoration
