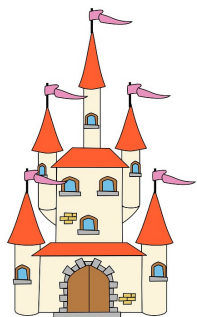


Summer Term (i) 2019 — Years 1 and 2
