Humanities

Investigate various sources of information in order to learn about aspects of a child's life in the Victorian era e.g. - toys, school life, food, clothes, work.

Learn about the history of Susan Rees, a girl who worked in a coal mine.

Compare the life of a child today with the life of a child in the Victorian era.

Learn about religious ceremonies involving babies - the Sikh religion naming and the Christian baptism ceremonies..

Health and Wellbeing

Continue to develop our fitness and our gymnastic skills.

Enjoy new outdoor experiences during Forest School sessions.

Discuss the school rules and how to be responsible citizens.

Understand our rights and responsibilities in order to be able to respect the rights of others.

We aim to develop curious and inquisitive learners who are able to think critically. We intend to investigate and evaluate evidence and sources of information in order to identify similarities and differences in the lives of children today and the past. We hope to develop a deeper understanding of people's experiences within local contexts in order to develop informed learners who can communicate confidently and show empathy towards others. By the end of the learning unit, we trust that the learners will appreciate their rights and will have developed a body of knowledge through researching their identity and the history of Wales.

Develop our drawing skills and develop the skill of drawing portraits.

Visits

Visit Swansea Museum to learn more about the life of a child in Victorian times.

Visit the Glynn Vivian gallery for a portrait creation workshop.

Science and Technology

Explore and explain the basic properties of light and electricity.

To understand that darkness is the absence of light.

Ask questions and suggest simple methods of enquiry.

Enjoy predicting outcomes and carry out simple investigations.

Enjoy the experience of creating electrical circuits and understand the dangers of electricity.

Understand the life cycle of human beings.

Languages, Literacy and Communication

Create a role play corner e.g. a Toy Shop and enjoy buying and selling a variety of toys.

Develop our oracy skills through various activities.

Read and listen to a variety of non-fiction and fictional stories and books.

Enjoy watching television programmes such as 'Amser Maith Maith yn Ôl.'

Continue to develop our reading skills.

Enjoy writing in a variety of ways, including presenting information, a portrait, and a diary.

Continue to practice our spelling skills and learn to form letters correctly.

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It's planning time!

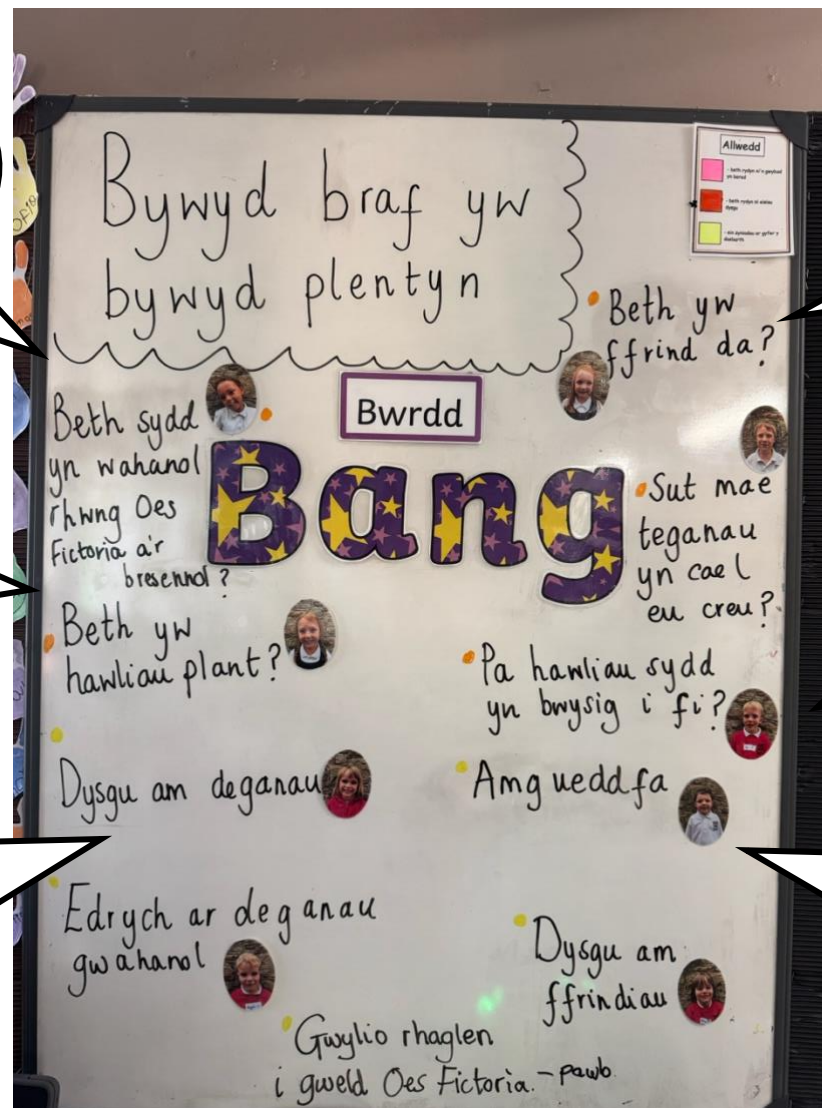
Our Closing Project
