- Learn how to organise and use data.



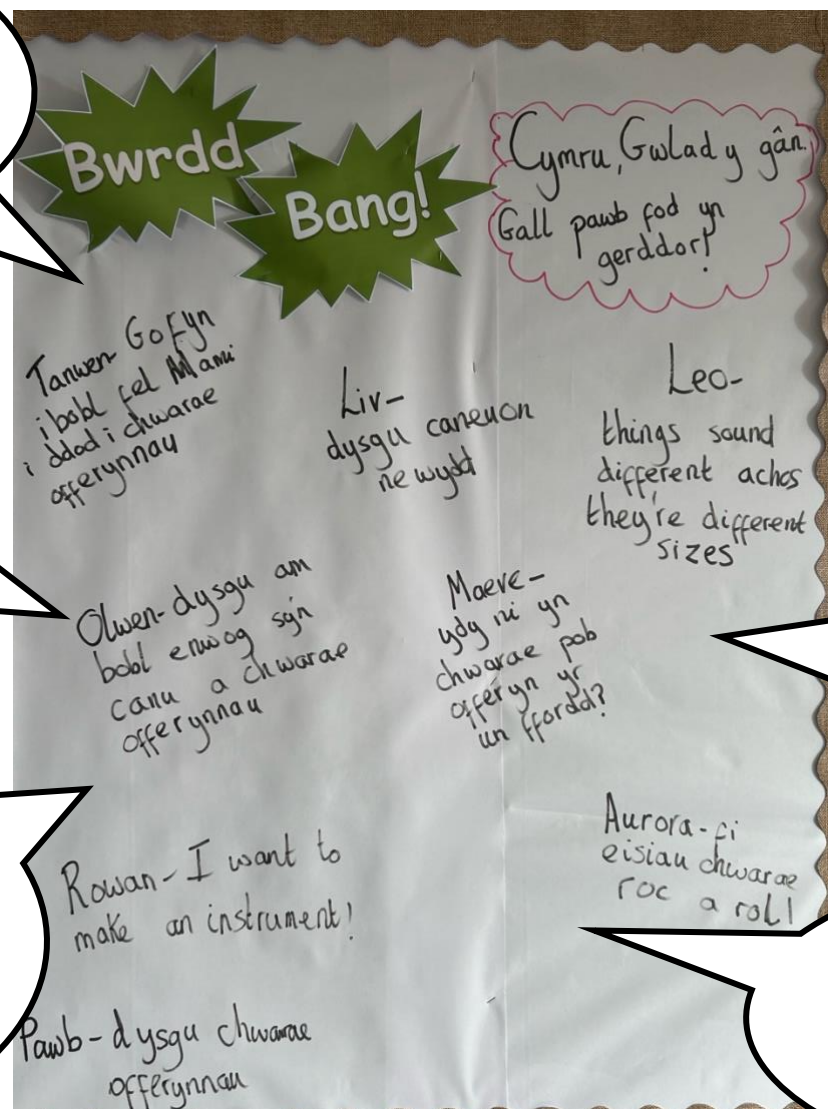
