Question:	Answer:
Do children need to wear a school uniform?	Not in the summer term
Do we know what the arrangements are for the autumn term and when will the first day be for my child?	As of yet, we have not been given direction. There may be potential for a staggered return to school and capacity may also change. As soon as we are given direction and guild lines – we will let you know.
Remote learning	Remote learning will be a continuous provision of work that children can access when they can / or are ready at any point throughout the week . On Wednesday – teachers will be uploading work / marking / and meeting with pupil should they need to. The expectation of which activities need to be complete and by when, will be provided by the teacher. Remote learning will be available to all including nursery and reception.
Live learning – This will happen using TEAMS on office Microsoft in HWB Please see the following link to learn more about TEAMS https://hwb.gov.wales/distance-learning-videos This link above is very good to help support you and your child using HWB – Lots of tutorials https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=i0TIQXmFGdQ	There will be a timetable with children placed into specific groups. (This will be shared soon). When organising the groups, staff will try to ensure that siblings are not given the same time to help ease pressure on the demand for technology at home. The live learning lessons will be available to all including nursery and reception. You must return the home/school contract for your child to take part in these meetings/lessons. To begin, the sessions will last about 15 minutes. This many change as we become more used to the process.
I answered <i>no</i> or <i>maybe</i> in the questionnaire about the return to school for my child. Is there still available capacity for my child if he / she still wants to attend?	There may be some spaces left in some groups, but there will be a constraint on availability. There will be space in the transition sessions.
In which class will my child be next year?	You will be informed of your child's class for academic year 20-21 in the week beginning 6/7/2020 via e mail.

When will the reports be coming out to parents?	Reports will come out via e mail in the week beginning 6/7/2020. Make sure the school has an up to date e-mail.
Hand washing?	Hand washing will happen at many different intervals during the sessions including but not exclusively to: • Entering the building • Using the toilet • Touching, eyes, nose or mouth • Playing outside • Sneezing/blowing nose • Contact with blood/body fluids • Before and after eating and drinking • Before and after starting new activities • Going home
What cleaning and prevention of infection controls will be in place?	Cleaning staff will be in every morning to clean the school. They will have a thorough cleaning schedule. We also have additional cleaning staff that will be cleaning throughout the day. School staff will also be cleaning high use areas regularly. There will be a one way directional flow around the school – clearly marked. A staggered break time table will ensure that groups of children do not mix. A 3m2 guidance has been advised between pupils when in the class. No parent will be allowed inside the school building and on the yard. The contractors on the school premise will also follow hygiene and cleaning procedures. All staff will follow our operational guide to opening the school. Information posters will be displayed to staff and pupils.
Toilet	There will be a limit of 3 children in the toilet areas at any one time. The toilets will be monitored. Hand hygiene reminded.
What happens if someone become ill?	If a child becomes ill and has suspected covid symptoms during the school day there is an isolation room within the

	school. As soon as a pupil displays symptoms, the pupil will be kept in the room until parents/ carers are able to collect. The pupil must be collected from the Brynmill entrance NOT the main reception. A member of staff will bring the child out to the parent . Staff will have PPE available to them.
What can my child bring to school?	In the summer term – as little as possible. A snack, a drink and a pencil case if necessary.
What will happen in the transitions week?	A time table will be sent out to you as soon as possible. The purpose of the transition week is for pupils to meet their new teachers and go to their new classroom.
Will my child be able to use the water fountain?	No. Due to the risk assessment the water fountains won't be available. Please ensure your child brings their own drink.
